Michael Aldred graduated with a Bachelor of Dental Surgery (with Commendation) from the University of Wales in 1977. In 1978 he was appointed Lecturer in Oral Pathology at the University of Wales College of Medicine in Cardiff, UK. He obtained his Fellowship in Dental Surgery in 1981, a PhD in 1986 and Membership of the Royal College of Pathologists in 1987. He spent the period 1989 to 1992 at the Institute of Medical Genetics in Cardiff on two consecutive Medical Research Council fellowships. In 1991 he became a Senior Lecturer in Oral Medicine and Pathology at the University of Wales College of Medicine before moving to Australia in 1992 to take up the appointment of Senior Lecturer in Oral Biology in the Department of Dentistry at The University of Queensland. In 1995 he was promoted to Reader and Associate Professor. In 1996 he was awarded a Foundation Fellowship of the Royal College of Pathologists of Australasia in 1996 and his FRCPath (UK) was granted in 1997. In 1997 he was appointed as Professor of Dental Medicine at The University of Melbourne. In 2001 he resigned from his academic position to concentrate on diagnostic Oral Pathology and clinical Oral Medicine. As well providing Oral Pathology reports for Dorevitch Pathology, he runs a specialist private practice in Oral Medicine and holds an appointment as Consultant in Oral Medicine at the Royal Dental Hospital of Melbourne. He has expertise in dental genetics and dental hard tissue pathology, has published over 70 clinical and scientific papers and contributed to several books. He has been Chair and Secretary (twice) of the Faculty of Oral Pathology of the Royal College of Pathologists of Australasia and has been Secretary of IAOP since 2004.
